HERITAGE ALTERATION PERMIT INFORMATION

Does the Cookstown Heritage Conservation District (HCD) apply to my property?

 If your property falls within the HCD boundary, (see map on other side), then the HCD applies to your property.

Does the HCD designation change my rights to sell my property?

 No, it doesn't change how properties are bought or sold. The designation is registered on title to the property.

What is a Heritage Alteration Permit (HAP)?

 A HAP is required to make certain changes to properties designated under the Ontario Heritage Act. Properties are either designated individually or as part of a Heritage Conservation District. There is NO FEE for this permit.

What can I do WITHOUT a HAP?

- Interior renovations.
- General maintenance and repairs with the same materials.
- Alterations at the rear of the building, not visible from the street.
- Paving/re-paving of existing driveway.
- Small (< 10 m²) rear yard outbuildings, stand-alone garages/buildings.*
- Exterior re-painting of previously painted surfaces.
- · Minor landscaping and gardening.

What do I need a HAP for?

 Property owners within the HCD boundary are encouraged to contact Town staff ahead of exterior renovations to find out if a permit is required.

MINOR HAP Applications[†]

- Required for smaller construction and alteration work.
- Reviewed and approved by Town staff.
- If approval is denied, you can request council to reconsider the application.

MAJOR HAP Applications[†]

- Required for significant construction/work.
- Reviewed by Town staff and forwarded to Council for approval.
- If demolition or removal of structures is proposed, the application will be referred to the Heritage Committee for recommendation and Council will make the final decision.

Will heritage designation prevent contemporary design?

- The Cookstown HCD Plan and Design Guidelines have been crafted to allow for various designs.
- Heritage character has been assessed and some buildings have been identified as contributing and others as noncontributing.
- HAP requirements for each type of building, as well as vacant lots, can be obtained by contacting the Town.

Can I get help paying for conservation or restoration work in the HCD?

- The Town undertook a Community Improvement Plan (CIP) process to identify grants and other financial assistance programs.
- The Cookstown CIP allows owners of a Group "A" or "B" property within the HCD and property owners within the "Financial Incentives" area to apply for CIP funding to cover a portion of their project costs. An application for CIP funding can be processed at the same time as the Heritage Alteration Permit.


Approval Process

- Contact the Manager of Planning (Heritage Administrator) to discuss how your plans can meet heritage guidelines.
- Permit applications that meet heritage guidelines and are minor in nature can be reviewed and approved by the Heritage Administrator (some same day).
- Approval of a HAP must precede other municipal approvals, including building permits, site plan, and minor variances.

WHAT IS THE COOKSTOWN HERITAGE CONSERVATION DISTRICT (HCD)?

- The Ontario Heritage Act provides municipalities the opportunity to designate areas that have distinct heritage character. This designation allows a municipality to provide policies and guidelines in an HCD Plan.
- The Plan provides a framework for making building and works within the HCD boundary more consistent with the character of the area.
- These character elements can include the age and quality of the buildings, streetscapes, and open space.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE COOKSTOWN HCD?

- Protects and enhances features that give Cookstown a unique identity within Innisfil and beyond.
- Promotes heritage tourism and community recognition.
- Prevents inappropriate development and demolition applications from moving forward without a Town Council decision.
- Provides opportunities for small to medium businesses to locate in a community with a unique character and identity.
- Properties within HCDs show average to above average value appreciation compared to comparable properties without such designations.
- Sets clear guidelines and policies for new development.
