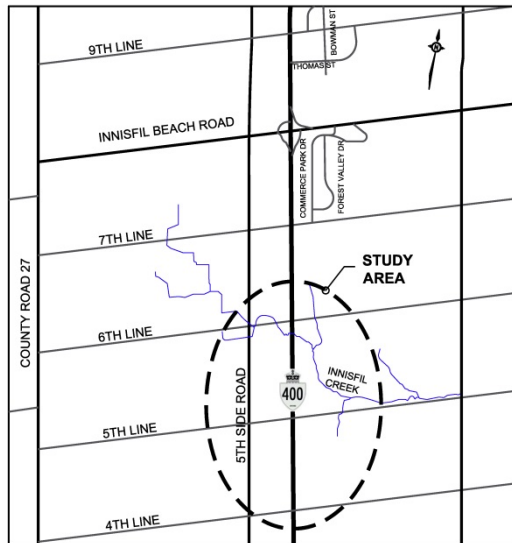




NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

6th Line Interchange Municipal Class Environmental Assessment



The Town of Innisfil has completed a Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for a proposed interchange at 6th Line and Highway 400. The 6th Line Interchange project was completed as a Schedule C project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (2007) process, as amended in 2011 and 2015.

The study recommendations are documented in an Environmental Study Report (ESR) that is now available for public review. The ESR describes the project need and justification, existing environmental conditions, recommended plan and mitigation measures for the study.

If there are any concerns regarding this project which cannot be resolved in discussion with the Town, a person or party may request that the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environment assessments. Requests may be received by the Minister and Director of the Environmental Approvals Branch of the MOECC (at the addresses noted below) prior to **March 1, 2017**. A copy of the request must also be sent to the Town contact noted above. If there are no requests received within the 30-day review period, the project will receive environmental clearance. Subsequently, the project may proceed to design and construction, dependent on available funding.
