



Rapid Growth

Innisfil is experiencing rapid growth, outpacing the rates of both Simcoe County and Ontario. Innisfil's population grew by 32% from 2011 to 2021 and is projected to double to 85,000 by 2051. Employment is also on the rise, with over 10,000 jobs in 2023, expected to increase to 26,000 by 2051.

Innisfil is centrally located along Highway 400 between Toronto and Barrie, providing businesses direct access to significant and growing markets. Our Economic Development team offers comprehensive support to investors, helping unlock the potential of Innisfil's strategic advantages.

Forecasted Growth

- Population Growth: Innisfil's population grew by 32% between 2011 and 2021 and is forecasted to double to 85,000 by 2051, reflecting strong long-term growth.
- Employment Growth: Innisfil currently supports over 10,000 jobs, with this figure projected to rise to 26,000 by 2051 as the town's key employment sectors expand.

Location & Connectivity

- Innisfil is situated on Highway 400 between Toronto and Barrie, with proximity to Lake Simcoe Regional Airport, offering exceptional connectivity.
- → Innisfil is centrally located within Simcoe County, which has an estimated population of over 530,000 people, and is adjacent to the City of Barrie (population 212,856) and York Region (population 1,239,500). Access to CN's rail network via the Barrie Collingwood Railway enables seamless expansion into North American markets.

Labour Market

- Innisfil's central location within the County of Simcoe ensures businesses have access to a skilled labour pool of over 238,465 people, with 1.7 million more workers within a one-hour commute.
- Innisfil works closely with strategic partners including the County of Simcoe, Lakehead University and Georgian College to support talent attraction, workforce development and the creation of customized programming to support the evolving needs of local employers.



Population: In 2021, Innisfil had a population of 43,326, with an annual growth rate of 3.45%. (2021 census vs 2016 census).

Advanced Manufacturing: As a key export and employment sector in Innisfil, manufacturing is bolstered by specializations in plastics, rubber, transportation equipment, and machinery. To ensure the sector's continued economic competitiveness, Innisfil is committed to building an ecosystem that supports investment in digital technologies, enhances supply network visibility, and fosters a more agile, knowledge-based workforce. With ample room to expand lean and light manufacturing, Innisfil is positioned as a strategic location for growth and innovation in advanced manufacturing.

Agri-Technology and Food

Creative Industries: Innisfil's proximity to major urban centers and rich cultural assets create an ideal environment for the growth of creative industries. The town encourages development in digital media, design, and other creative fields, fostering a vibrant economy that attracts talent and nurtures small businesses in these creative sectors.

Tourism & Recreation: Innisfil's tourism sector offers diverse recreational and cultural experiences, from Lake Simcoe's waterfront activities to destinations like Gateway Casinos, Georgian Downs, and Friday Harbour Resort. Expanding on agri-tourism and food tourism highlights the town's rural charm, drawing both visitors and residents.

Life Sciences: Innisfil has growing potential in life sciences, especially with the upcoming development of the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre's South Campus within the community. This new healthcare hub will bring job growth and attract healthcare-related businesses, supporting Innisfil's emerging identity in this sector.

Clean-Tech Supply Chain: Innisfil is pursuing growth in the clean-tech and renewable energy sectors by building on its established waste management and manufacturing base. The town is committed to green building practices, energy efficiency, and sustainable business operations, aligning with provincial trends and establishing Innisfil as a sustainable choice for forward-thinking industries.



Major Developments

Significant projects such as the ongoing development of Innisfil Heights, The Orbit, the proposed GO station, and a hospital campus highlight Innisfil's potential for business and community growth.

The Orbit: The Orbit is a visionary, high-density, transitoriented community centered around the proposed Innisfil GO Station at 6th Line. Designed to blend urban and small-town living, it aims to foster growth while preserving Innisfil's agricultural lands and natural landscapes. By promoting smart, sustainable development, The Orbit will integrate residential, commercial, and recreational spaces to create a vibrant and diverse community.

Innisfil GO Station: The development of the Innisfil GO Station is set to significantly enhance connectivity and accessibility for residents and businesses alike. Nestled within the Orbit project, the station will serve as a vital link between Innisfil and the Greater Toronto Area via the GO Transit network. This increased accessibility will broaden workforce options, attract businesses that rely on transportation hubs, and stimulate both residential and commercial development around the Orbit.

Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre South Campus:

Situated at the intersection of Yonge Street and Innisfil Beach Road, the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre's (RVH) South Campus will initially feature a Health Hub offering outpatient care, with plans to expand into a full-service hospital complete with an emergency department and operating rooms over the next 20 years. This development will enhance healthcare access and create local job opportunities, further reinforcing Innisfil's commitment to community growth.

Gateway Casinos Expansion: Gateway Casino's planned expansion positions Innisfil as a key entertainment hub within the region. This proposed investment aims to enhance accessibility for visitors and create a vibrant entry point to Innisfil, attracting both local patrons and tourists. The expansion is expected to add approximately 200 new jobs to the casino's current workforce and contributing to local employment growth. By anchoring commercial development in the area, the Gateway project supports Innisfil's strategy to retain economic investment locally, offering nearby businesses increased traffic and revenue.

- Lakehead University complements these efforts through its Office of Innovation, Partnerships, and Economic Development (IPED), driving industry-academic collaborations.

Together, these institutions foster a dynamic ecosystem of talent development and applied research, advancing Innisfil's expertise in skilled trades and innovation while supporting the growth of local industries.



Innisfil Heights Investment Readiness

The Innisfil Heights Employment Area is a cornerstone of Innisfil's economic strategy, featuring over 1,600 acres of land along Highway 400, poised for industrial, commercial, and tourism development. This prime location provides businesses with easy access to major transportation corridors and proximity to the Greater Toronto Area.

Expected to generate over 16,000 jobs across various sectors, including manufacturing and logistics, Innisfil Heights presents significant opportunities for expansion. The Town is committed to investing in the necessary infrastructure to support seamless operations and attract both local and international investors.



Our Commitment to Preparing Lands for Investment:

Innisfil Heights Action Plan: The Innisfil Heights Action Plan includes nineteen strategic actions to enhance investment readiness in the Innisfil Heights Employment Area, aiming to attract investment, generate jobs, and accelerate economic growth. Proposed action items include:

- Community Improvement Plan (CIP): Our ongoing development of targeted CIPs aims to attract high-value investments in key sectors and support industrial and mixed-use development.
- Community Permit Planning System (CPPS): Streamlines development approvals to support faster and more efficient project launches.
- Master Drainage Study: Provides comprehensive drainage solutions, ensuring sustainable and effective stormwater management for new developments.
- Accelerated Approvals: Exploring opportunities to streamline approval processes with external agencies to reduce hurdles and expedite project timelines.

Strategic Infrastructure: Direct connections to the Barrie Collingwood Railway (BCRY) facilitate connections to CN's rail network and enables expansion opportunities across North America.

Site Selection Response Team (SSRT): A dedicated response team, led by Economic Development, has been established to streamline communication, improve response times, and enhance applicant experience.

The SSRT serves as a single point of contact for inquiries, promoting transparency and competitiveness while providing insights and guidance on strategic initiatives such as investment readiness scoring and landowner forums. The team also aims to support corporate priorities by delivering feedback within five business days on Requests for Information (RFIs).
