Role Overview

Hospitality and tourism support staff work in hotels, resorts, restaurants, and attractions. They provide frontline services that shape visitor experiences, including greeting guests, serving food, maintaining cleanliness, preparing meals, and supporting recreational programming.

These are the people who represent Innisfil's warm hospitality. Whether welcoming guests, facilitating events, or delivering memorable meals, support staff are essential to the smooth operation of tourism-focused businesses across the region.

These roles are critical in service-oriented businesses including hotels, inns, restaurants, community centres, event venues, and seasonal destinations like beaches and campgrounds.
