Welders and fabricators join metal components using welding equipment and blueprint specifications. They may also cut, shape, and repair metal structures, often playing a crucial role in custom manufacturing and the assembly of heavy equipment.

Education & Training Pathways

Welder training programs emphasize safety, welding theory, and practical welding techniques. Fabricators often require additional mechanical or blueprint reading skills.

Local Program Spotlight:

Georgian College – Welding Techniques Provides hands-on training in multiple welding processes with safety and industry-standard certifications. Graduates are eligible to pursue apprenticeships.

Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) is also an option for high school students.
